

## Sail cruising course joining instructions

**Joining the boat:** Please be at the boat in Nelson Marina at 10 am on day one of your course. The course finishes at about 3pm on the last day. We can be found at berth C37, down at the end of C dock, close to the Tasman Bay Cruising Club, a large red building on Cross Quay, Port Nelson 7010.

### Parking and transport

**Car:** Plenty of free parking available at the marina

**Bus:** 20 minute walk to the marina from the bus station in central Nelson

**Plane:** Nelson airport is less than 8km away: normally about 15 mins by taxi.

**Sailing area\*:** Our sailing grounds are around Tasman Bay, often including the beautiful Abel Tasman National Park or perhaps D'Urville Island and the outer Marlborough Sounds. <https://sailnelson.co.nz/sailing-grounds/> Nights are spent sleeping aboard at anchor or on moorings in the most scenic spots. <https://sailnelson.co.nz/the-week-on-board/>

**Clothing:** Nelson is renowned as New Zealand's sunniest location, but the temperature can fluctuate quite widely throughout the day and night, especially in the shoulder season, so it's wise to pack warm clothing for early and late in the day as well as for night sailing. During the day the sun can be very powerful, so a sunhat, sunglasses and sunscreen are essential items. Long sleeved thin tops are also a good idea. Soft closed shoes such as trainers are suitable as footwear. Going ashore in the dinghy be prepared to get wet feet on the beach. Please bring your own towel and you might also like to bring your swimming things.

**Food and drink:** Sail Nelson provide all the delicious food for the week and we're happy to cater to your food preferences, providing you advise us in advance. If you'd like a beer or a glass of wine with your evening meal then please bring this with you. As well as the main meals we provide all the tea, coffee and snacks, but if you have any particularly favourite snack items then don't hesitate to bring these with you too.

**Fuel and Water:** The fuel and water tanks are fully topped up before we set off on day one and there is also the opportunity to top up the water during the week if necessary. We also carry bottled drinking water.

**Sleeping:** Our yachts have 3 separate double sleeping cabins plus two single bunks in the saloon. Please bring your own sleeping bag and we will provide you with a pillow and clean pillowcase. If required we can rent you a sleeping bag and clean cotton liner for a small charge.

**Wet weather gear:** We have spare foul weather jackets and trousers and are happy to rent these to you for a small charge too, but if you have your own we recommend that you bring them with you.

**Lifejackets and safety gear:** All the necessary safety gear, including lifejackets, is provided. Our life jackets are the self inflating type with built in safety harnesses. We also carry a liferaft, lifebuoys, flares, EPIRB and much more safety gear, too numerous to list here.

**Certificates:** At the end of the RYA course we issue you with the appropriate certificate for your skill and knowledge level. The cost of the certificate is included in your course fee, but don't forget to **bring a passport photo with you if you're going for Day Skipper or above.**

**People on board:** In addition to your instructor there will be a maximum of 5 and a minimum of 2 students on each course. Courses are generally made up of couples and/or individuals and we often teach people at different skill levels during the same week.

**Course payment:** The cost of your course will have been detailed on your original booking form. To confirm your place on a course we require you to have completed the booking form and also paid a \$600 deposit per person. Until then your booking remains provisional. The balance for your course is due not later than 14 days prior to the course commencing. Payments should be made to Sail Nelson NZ Ltd, Kiwibank. **Accommodation prior to/after the course:** Nelson has a wide selection of excellent accommodation to suit all budgets, but for a nice place to stay, with maximum convenience in terms of location, we recommend the Harbourside Lodge, which overlooks Nelson Marina: <https://harbourside.co.nz/> Please mention that you're doing a course with Sail Nelson when you book.

**\*For Yachtmaster only:**

This is a 5 day preparation week and a 2 day exam. All Yachtmaster candidates crew for each other during the practical exam, so by signing up for the preparation week you are committing to stay for the exam, even if you ultimately decide not to sit it for yourself. During the Yachtmaster preparation week you will sail and navigate more intensely and in a more limited geographical area than on our other courses. The exact exam duration will depend upon the number of candidates sitting the exam.
